Thoughts from Father Tony Dosen





As a seminarian in Perryville, many, many years ago, we would take walks in the evening down the side-walk between the novitiate and student buildings to the mound and then to the grotto. When there was a new moon and the night was dark, I walked ever so slowly, tapping my foot on the ground as I approached the stairs leading me from one level of sidewalk to the next. The truth be told, I could barely see the stairs when there was a full moon!

Several years ago, I turned that magic age where older people get their eyeballs cleaned and they can see again! Without glasses!! Cataract surgery was an amazing experience. Suddenly, my weary eyes that made the entire world look old, dim and dull, became eyes that turned the world into the set of a theatrical performance. Bright colors popped from the scenery and transformed the world into a bright, beautiful, and boldly colorful world. I went from having trifocals, to wearing "cheaters" that I used for my reading, (yes those glasses I wear at Mass when I read the missal, cost under \$10.00). Each time I hear the Gospel about the man born blind, I think of these experiences.

In today's Gospel, we hear the story of the man born blind. Listen to the questions that the people ask. "Is this the man who was born blind?" "Did his father or mother sin, thus causing him to be born blind?" "Was he really blind, or was he faking it?" These folks wanted answers, immediately! They wanted to know, especially the Pharisees and Sadducees. The blind man, who could now see, comments to their questioning, "Isn't this interesting? The very people, who always have the answers, don't know how it is that I can see." The healed man than commented, "I do not know how it came about, all I know is that I once was blind, but now I see."

In the everyday experiences of our lives, our own prejudices, weaknesses or just our plain old suffering blinds us. Then, through God's grace, we come to a moment of insight, conversion. We, who thought that our "regular way of doing things" was correct, have our eyes opened. We have a moment of conversion. Others may not understand what has happened to us, but we certainly have the insight that led John Newton to write the beautiful hymn.

Amazing grace, how sweet the sound! That saved a wretch like me! I once was lost, but now am found; Was blind, but now I see.

'Twas grace that taught my heart to fear, And grace my fears reliev'd; How precious did that grace appear, The hour I first believed.

Thro' many dangers, toils, and snares, I have already come; 'Tis grace has brought me safe thus far, And grace will lead me home.

When we've been there ten thousand years, Bright shining as the sun. We've no less days to sing God's praise Than when we first begun.



Archdiocesan Lenten Regulations

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him." (John 3:16-17)

The Church has always helped us fulfill these words of Jesus by prescribing very definite penance for all Catholics, so that we might have Eternal Life. Accordingly, the Pope and the American Bishops have outlined obligatory fast and abstinence as follows:

Ash Wednesday

(Feb. 22, 2023)

All Fridays of Lent

(Feb. 22-April 6, 2023)

Good Friday

(April 2, 2023)

These are days of abstinence (refraining from meat) for all Catholics from age 14 onwards. On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday we fast, as well as exercise abstinence from meat, is also obligatory for those ages 18-59. Abstinence means, one full meal a day, with two smaller meals and no snacking between meals, liquids are permitted. No Catholic will excuse him/herself from this obligation.

Feast of St. Patrick

(March 17, 2023)

This Feast Day falls on a Friday during Lent this year. Feasts of the Church are meant to be a day of rejoicing and celebration, so on this Friday, March 17, 2023, the faithful of the Archdiocese of St. Louis are omitted from abstaining from meat should they choose to celebrate the Feast of St. Patrick.
