

John 15:1-8

"I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I in him."



Today, the scriptures invite us to reflect on the theme of community, abiding in love, and bearing fruit in our lives as disciples of Jesus Christ.

In the Acts of the Apostles, we witness the transformation of Saul, who persecuted the followers of Christ, into Paul, a beloved member of the Christian community. His conversion highlights the power of forgiveness and reconciliation within the body of Christ. Just as the early disciples embraced Paul despite his past, we are called to welcome one another with open hearts, recognizing that God's grace is available to all who seek it.

The Psalmist reminds us of the faithfulness of God, who hears the cries of the oppressed and sustains those who put their trust in Him. Even in the midst of trails and tribulations, we are encouraged to praise the Lord and proclaim His goodness to all nations. Our faithfulness to God's promises strengthens our bonds of unity as we worship Him together.

In his letter, John challenges us to move beyond mere words and to demonstrate our love for one another through our actions. Love is not simply a sentiment; it is a choice to serve and care for one another in tangible ways. When we abide in love, we abide in God, and His Spirit dwells within us, empowering us to live as true Disciples of Christ.

Finally, Jesus uses the metaphor of the vine and the branches to illustrate the importance of remaining connected to Him in order to bear fruit. Just as a branch cannot bear fruit unless it abides in the vine, we cannot bear the fruits of the Spirit unless we abide in Christ. Through prayer, scripture, sacraments, and fellowship with other believers, we nourish our relationship with Christ and are empowered to bear fruit that glorifies God.

My dear friends, let us heed the call of these readings. Let us seek reconciliation with those we have wronged and extend forgiveness to those who have hurt us. Let us remain faithful to God, trusting in His promises even in the face of adversity. Let us love one another, not only in words but in deeds, serving as instruments of God's grace and mercy. And let us abide in Christ, drawing near to Him through prayer, scripture, and sacrament, that we may bear fruit that will last.

May the Holy Spirit empower us to live out these truths in our lives, so that we may be light to the world and a witness to transforming power of God's love.



#### FROM THE ANTI-RACISM AND RACIAL EQUITY WORKING GROUP

Recently I encountered a gentleman in my office building as he was making his way to an evaluation for disability. That encounter has stayed with me. He was a Black middle-age to older person, and indicated needing the elevator because of knee pain from having been physically beaten at some previous time. This happened during Holy Week and I found myself reflecting that he bore the pains of Christ. Though it's not just him and his Black body. So many Black and Brown women and men bear the pain and suffering of Christ. These are difficult truths for us, I think. Difficult for us to witness and sit with, as they take us out of our comfort zone. Dr. Peter Watts, a pastor with The ROCK Church in Los Angeles, invites his community, and us, to breath prayers as an avenue for healing spiritual and physical traumas. He notes Jesus' words to Thomas in the Gospel of John: "Put your finger here. See my hands. Reach out and put your hand in my side. Stop doubting and believe." We are invited to see, touch, experience and believe. To recognize the need for healing trauma by using the body and specifically, the breath. Connecting with our body by turning inward, perhaps using a simple prayer of calling upon Jesus while inhaling, holding the breath and slowly exhaling. And allowing ourselves to ponder the suffering of Christ carried by those around us each and every day.
