Thoughts from Father Tony Dosen



My very dear friends in Christ,

This Lenten Season has moved faster than any other Lent that I can remember. We are just a week away from Holy Week. On this last week of the Lenten season, I want to share some reflections about change. One of the hymns we have sung during this Lenten season is "Change our hearts, O Lord." In reality, it does sum up what all of this season is about. We are called to change, to convert, if you will. We rededicate ourselves to following God's plan for us, becoming the best person that we can be.

This year, the call to conversion and change is especially poignant. By Pentecost Sunday (May 28) we, as a parish, will embark on a journey, which is unlike any journey we have ever encountered. All Things New will move from planning to implementation. Also, the Vincentian provincial planning will continue to move forward. We are living in a time of change, as a parish and as an Archdiocese. Therefore, it might be good for us to reflect a bit about change.

My thoughts today build on the work of William Bridges, Ph.D. in his work Managing Transitions. Any organization or group gets to be very comfortable with how things operate. Whether a Fortune 500 Company, or a school district, an archdiocese, or even a small southcity parish church, each organization becomes very comfortable in the way things were. Unfortunately, organizations are not buildings, but rather groups of people. It is living. If it is not living anymore, it is dead! If we are to live, we must continue to adapt.

Bridges focuses on the change process. In our transition from the way things were, to the new way of doing things, we have to determine how we move forward, and then we need to practice. Every time we practice, we gradually get better. Whether it is practicing a musical instrument, having the golf ball hit perfectly on the green, or tearing the leather off a baseball with a homerun hit. None of these activities are perfect on the first try. A good coach (teacher) knows that success is the product of hard work and learning from our mistakes. A good coach (teacher) also knows that we need to celebrate small wins. "This essay is improved over your previous essays. Your use of punctuation has greatly improved."

As we make our transitions as All Things New moves forward, let us remember that each of us needs to mind the gap. We need to encourage one another. We need to be good coaches. Our parish staff need patiently to encourage each member of the parish, and one another, parishioners need to encourage staff as they begin to see the new reality move into place. In short, we are all coaches and all beginners in our new reality. Let us be wise coaches, and eager beginners in the game of parish renewal. In short, let us encourage one another in the Lord. So that what has begun in us, might be brought to completion.

Easter is the time of new and renewed life. We are in the midst of creating a renewed life in Christ. May our parish community find renewed life, so that our ministries become ever more focused on the Risen Christ, who renews and blesses all our efforts and good works.



Archdiocesan Lenten Regulations

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him." (John 3:16-17)

The Church has always helped us fulfill these words of Jesus by prescribing very definite penance for all Catholics, so that we might have Eternal Life. Accordingly, the Pope and the American Bishops have outlined obligatory fast and abstinence as follows:


Ash Wednesday (Feb. 22, 2023) All Fridays of Lent (Feb. 22-April 6, 2023) Good Friday (April 2, 2023)

These are days of abstinence (refraining from meat) for all Catholics from age 14 onwards. On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday we fast, as well as exercise abstinence from meat, is also obligatory for those ages 18-59. Abstinence means, one full meal a day, with two smaller meals and no snacking between meals, liquids are permitted. No Catholic will excuse him/herself from this obligation.

Feast of St. Patrick

(March 17, 2023)

This Feast Day falls on a Friday during Lent this year. Feasts of the Church are meant to be a day of rejoicing and celebration, so on this Friday, March 17, 2023, the faithful of the Archdiocese of St. Louis are omitted from abstaining from meat should they choose to celebrate the Feast of St. Patrick.
