Pope Leo told her that there were so many immigrants in the United States who were struggling that he wanted her to go there and serve the immigrants in the U.S. She fought the people in power who were oppressing immigrants. She helped build schools and hospitals for immigrants in New York, Chicago, Colorado, and even in South America
