“When we deal with each other, we should do so with the sense of awe that arises in the presence of something holy and sacred. For that is what human beings are: we are created in the image of God (Gn 1:27). Similarly, all economic institutions must support the bonds of community and solidarity that are essential to the dignity of persons. Wherever our economic arrangements fail to conform to the demands of human dignity lived in community, they must be questioned and transformed.”

The theme of Solidarity permeates much of Catholic Social Teaching because it is intrinsically connected to our shared human dignity. Helping one another is not just a nice suggestion, it is demanded by our common humanity.

Daily call to action:

Do we deal with each other *“with the sense of awe that arises in the presence of something holy and sacred”*?

Let’s take some time to examine how we interact with each other. Let’s also take some time to examine whether our economic institutions truly support community.

Intercessions/ our prayer for our world:
