





From the Parochial Administrator's Desk...

The Town Hall Meeting is taking place today! I must admit that I am both excited and a little nervous about our gathering today. I am excited about the possibility of interacting with one another: you and I, the parish community, and your priests; the parish community with one another; and the parish community and our parish staff / leaders. I am nervous (just a little)



that things will not go perfectly. I am pushing the nervousness aside. It is not important whether I think that the process went perfectly. What is important is that we have gathered and shared with one another what God is speaking to us about our mission as a parish, our ministries, and our hopes for the future. This is what Pope Francis had in mind, when he asked all members of the Church, throughout the world, to discern together in their local communities and to discern where God is calling us in these first decades of the Twenty-First Century.

We as a parish community in the heart of St. Louis have many things to pray about. *All Things New* has been a part of our lives for over a year. Now that the data is in, all that seems left is to find out what "the chancery" is going to do. Yet, we have to also determine how we are going to do things and also to determine where God is going to call us in the days, weeks, and months ahead.

There are three questions that I would like to address during the Town Hall meetings.

In what ways can we become an even better welcoming community? Notice I said even better. It is not that we are not doing this right now, because we truly are. But how can we do an even better job of being welcoming. Also, how can we allow ourselves to be welcomed into the lives of other Catholics in our area as we come together. Can we offer and accept the best of who we are? Welcoming is a two-way street; it is not a one-way street.

How can we learn to collaborate with one another? The Church is changing, and I think perhaps for the better. We are recognizing one another's talents and gifts and sharing them with one another and the whole people of God. The days of "Father knows best" are gone. We must work together as a team, a team that always listens to the promptings of the Holy Spirit and moves in the direction where the Spirit beckons us. Sometimes this can be difficult. Can we redouble our efforts at working as a team?

Finally, our Baptism calls us to be bearers of the Good News. We are called to evangelize. This does not necessarily mean that we need to have our own television network. Rather, it means that we need to work together, in a welcoming way, so that people will be drawn to have some of what we have. What is it that we have? Grace. Oh, for the sake of saying this in a different sort of way, we have God's love coming down on each of us. How do we share that love of God? Our welcoming and being welcomed, that two-way street, becomes the first way we can share that love with others. The second is very similar. Can we learn to work together with the local community here in our neighborhood? How might we do this?

These are the things that I hope we can talk about today. Also, I hope that as we listen to one another, we might grow into an even tighter, loving community. No matter what *All Things New* brings to us, we will be ready to move forward, following Christ the Evangelizer of the poor, into the coming decades of the Twenty-First century.



What did Pope Francis Say? Vatican City

Brothers and sisters, God is like this: he does not "rest easy" if we stray from Him, he is grieved, He trembles in his innermost being; and he sets out to look for us, until He takes us back into his arms. The Lord does not calculate losses and risks; he has the heart of a father and a mother, and suffers for the lack of his beloved children. "But why does he suffer if this

son is a scoundrel, if he has gone?" He suffers, he suffers. God suffers for our distance and when we go astray, he awaits our return. Remember: God always awaits us with open arms, whatever the situation in life in which we are lost may be. As a Psalm says, He will "neither slumber nor sleep", he always watches over us

Let us look at ourselves now, and ask ourselves: do we imitate the Lord in this, that is, are we anxious about what is missing? Do we have nostalgia for those who are missing, who have drifted from Christian life? Do we carry this inner restlessness, or are we serene and undisturbed among ourselves? In other words, do we truly miss those who are missing from our communities, or do we pretend and not let it touch our hearts? Do I truly miss those who are missing in my life? Or are we comfortable among ourselves, calm and blissful in our groups – "I attend a very good apostolic group..." – without compassion for those who are far away? It is not a question merely of being "open to others", it is the Gospel! The shepherd of the parable did not say, "I have another ninety-nine sheep, why should I waste time to go and look for the lost one?" Instead, he went to look. Let us then reflect on our relationships: do I pray for those who do not believe, who have drifted away, who are bitter? Do we attract those who are distant through the style of God, which is closeness, compassion and tenderness? The Father asks us to be attentive to the children he misses the most. Let us think of someone we know, who is close to us and has perhaps never heard anyone say, "You know, you are important to God". "But I am in an irregular situation, I have done this bad thing, that one...". "You are important to God", say to him. "You are not searching for him, but he is searching for you".

On Saturday, Sept 17th after the 4:30p Mass, & on Sunday, Sept 18th after both the 9 & 11am Masses, there will be a "Town Hall" Meeting for the Parish, hosted by Fr. Tony. We will meet in the Hall after Mass for coffee, donuts, and important conversations about the Parish. Each meeting should last no more than 1/2 hour. This will be the first of several Town Hall meetings we will host throughout the year. Your input is valuable to all of us as we move forward in this process.
